A Brief History of ICASSI

Rudolf Dreikurs established ICASSI and the Summer Institute in 1962. Dreikurs created ICASSI because of his ongoing dedication to spreading the teachings of Adler to people around the world, not only as a psychological method of treatment, but as a philosophy of life. In his early days of practicing psychiatry in Vienna, Dreikurs saw the need to extend his office into the community. He was convinced that use of Adlerian education methods in the home and in the school would enable children to reach a higher level of functioning. He believed they would develop a greater sense of their own strength and ability, and would learn the responsibility of citizenship in a free world. He was also convinced that prevention was more important than treatment. He visualized the acceptance of "social interest" among a steadily widening group of people world-wide, who would experience living in harmony and peace.
